**FDEP Compliance Evaluation Inspection at our Wastewater Plant:** Erica Peck of FDEP has notified us this week of the results of the inspection conducted on November 15, 2019. The facility has been determined to be in compliance. Great Job Paige, JC, Evelyn and staff!

1. **Road Widening at the Wastewater Plant:** Wayne met with Juanita Gaitan, Fire Prevention Officer for Hardee County Fire. The building permit for the electrical building was held up this summer because the road into the electrical building was not wide enough for the fire apparatus. I had negotiated with Chief Walker that if we could get the permit for construction to continue, we would fix the road after the contractors left the plant. Juanita showed Wayne the areas of concern. Wayne said he and his crew could do the work with a couple loads of shell. We will start the road widening the first of January.

**Animal Control:** Trina reports the dangerous dog case was postponed in court until the first of the year. The new Animal Control Ordinance draft has been completed and is under review. She is currently working on a neglect case and picked up two stray dogs this week. Kevin King of the Hardee County Health Dept. has obtained approval to pay for Trina's training in February on mosquito control. Trina has been working with Melissa Fox to closeing out the current CDBG grant.
